

2017 Zone 10 Zone-O-Rama
August 3 to 6 – Ponoka Ag Event Centre
General Show rules

Cheques payable to Zone 10 Paint Horse Committee. No post dated Cheques. \$25.00 NSF Fee.
All entries must be made and accounts paid prior to 12 noon on Sunday, August 6th or must wait until after hi points calculated.
Exhibitor Responsibility: (SC-160E)

1. Exhibitors are responsible for being knowledgeable of and following current rules set forth by APHA and Show Management.
 - a. Complete entry form legibly and accurately with information exactly as is printed on horse's registration papers.
 - b. Pre-entering and post-entering horses in correct halter and performance classes. A horse entered in the wrong class may be transferred to its correct class prior to that class being judged.
 - c. Reporting to the gate promptly for the class and notifying the gate personnel of tack changes needed.
 - d. Being considerate of other exhibitors and show management.Additionally, exhibitors, owners, trainers are responsible to be knowledgeable of Rule SC-085A Drugs and Medications, forbidden and conditionally permitted substances. Conditionally permitted substances require a completed medication report be filed with the show office.
2. The show secretary MUST inspect the registration papers (or copies of) on each horse entered. Entries shall be made in the name of the recorded owner. Geldings are not permitted to show with stallion papers. Rule SC-175G.
3. To enter Amateur or Novice Amateur class, you MUST present a current year APHA Amateur or Novice Amateur card and meet ownership requirement under Rule AM-020.
4. Youth Exhibitors MUST present a current APHA Youth membership card.
5. The condition of submitting entries or the first entry into the show ring of a horse or exhibitor shall be deemed as acceptance of the APHA Official Rule Book and Zone 10 General Show Rules.
6. The final right to settle all questions or disputes arising incidentally to the Horse Show is reserved to the Show Management and all exhibitors, trainers, riders or other participants therein, as a condition of admission, give unqualified consent to such methods of settlement and agree in advance to be bound thereby.
7. Show Management may combine or split classes according to APHA rules SC-185G and YP-75B. If classes are combined to make APHA point class, only one class award will be given in that class.
8. Anyone withdrawing (scratching) from a class must have advised the Show office of the scratch BEFORE the class being scratched has started entering the show ring. Failure to advise show office will mean the exhibitor shall forfeit their entry fee in accordance with Rule SC-185A. This also applies to those exhibitors with open cheques. EXCEPTION: Non-Point classes.
9. To be eligible for APHA Championship Classes ("CC" on roster), must sign up at the office and have paid \$15.00 entry fee for each Championship Class entered. Awarded based on results of Judges A & B on Thursday; Judges B & C on Friday and Judges D & E on Saturday. PLEASE NOTE: APHA has changed the eligibility requirements for exhibitors. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to review the APHA rules. Classes considered as APHA Championship Classes have been chosen according to the APHA criteria.
10. Hi Point Awards – NOTE for all divisions Halter is no longer mandatory but if entered will count toward Award:
Hi Point Youth (Walk Trot; 13 & Under; 14 to 18): One horse/one rider combination, must show in at least three (3) Youth performance classes (all Youth classes including Halter will count toward Award).
Hi Point Amateur Walk Trot: One horse/one rider combination, must show in at least three (3) Amateur walk trot performance classes (all Amateur Walk Trot classes as well as Amateur Halter will count toward award).
Hi Point Amateur: One horse/one rider combination, must show in at least three (3) Amateur performance classes (all Amateur classes including Halter will count toward award).
Hi Point Novice Amateur: One horse/one rider combination. All Novice Amateur classes will count, along with Amateur classes that are not offered in the Novice-Amateur program (eg Ranch Riding, Hunter Hack, Halter).
Hi Point Junior, Senior & Solid Paint Bred: Horse must compete in three (3) or more classes in the division (All Open classes, including Halter will count).
11. Ties for Hi Points will be broken using the following steps:
 1. The horse that earns the most firsts
 2. The horse that places the most times
 3. The flip of a coin

12. **Supreme Halter Horse:** will be calculated as follows: All Grand Champions will come back under each judge. If no Grand was awarded, first place horse is allowed to come back to show for Supreme Halter award. Each judge independently chooses their champion. If results in a tie will utilize a tie breaker system of recipient of the most Grands being the winner unless that is also a tie and then the recipient of the most Grands & Reserves becomes the Supreme Halter winner. *Hi Point Mare, Gelding and Stallion will also be chosen from those horses that have returned to be judged for Supreme Halter Horse. To be chosen by consultation of the judges.*
13. Awards must be picked up at the awards presentation with exception of Halter which will be awarded at the conclusion of Halter and Yearling Challenge will be awarded at the 15 th Anniversary Banquet. Awards to be picked up by Owner or Exhibitor or be forfeited.
14. All awards, entries, stabling and pay-outs are to be in Canadian funds.
15. All disputes/complaints must be submitted within 30 days of the show and will be resolved within 30 days of receipt.
16. All entries must be made and shown to all 6 judges to qualify for a Hi Point.
17. Trail Practice: Each horse entered in a trail class will be charged \$10 to be used toward arena fees for trail warm up.
18. **Arena Hours:** On Wednesday the arena will be open from 12 noon to 10 pm. During the show, the arena will be open at 6 am and close at 10 pm. (earlier if not being used). The PAECS will charge an overtime fee of \$120 (plus gst) per hour after 8 pm each day. Therefore we are asking all exhibitors to be prompt in reporting to the gate and entering and exiting the ring in order that the show can continue moving along.
